

A revision of *Caenodelphax* Fennah (Hemiptera: Fulgoroidea: Delphacidae) to include species misallocated to *Delphacodes* Fieber

The delphacid planthopper genus *Caenodelphax* Fennah, 1965, although small, has had a complicated taxonomic history. At this time, it consists of 4 species: *C. taepae*, *C. nigriscutellata*, *C. atridorsum*, and *C. philyra*; all previously assigned to *Delphacodes* Fieber, 1866. *Delphacodes* is a western Palearctic genus with 10 species, although there are over 124 New World species currently assigned to the genus. Hamilton (2002) redescribed *Ceanodelphax* in a broader sense than prior authors, and noted that about 10 species belonged in this genus, but did not specify the taxa except for *C. nigriscutellata*. This study will revise 14 *Caenodelphax* allied *Delphacodes* species with reference to a morphological and molecular phylogenetic analysis and develop online resources for included taxa.
