## Cixiidae and Delphacidae (Homoptera - Fulgoroidea) from Lebanon - a preliminary synopsis

In the past the Auchenorrhyncha fauna not only of Lebanon, but of the whole Near East had scarcely been investigated 1927: Linnavuori, 1962). (Haupt, Concerning Fulgoromorpha only (widespread) Delphacid-species and no single Cixiid-species were mentioned to be recorded from Lebanon (Nast, 1972).

extraordinary geographic Bv the position of Lebanon (here faunal elements of the Palearctic, Oriental and Ethiopian Region may meet) and its particular orological situation (Mt. Lebanon, reaching up to more than 3.000 m., may provide ideal conditions for

development of endemics as well as serve as a refugial area) a far richer fauna (not only for the Lebanese state territory which is rather small, but for the whole Near East) was to be expected.

The examination of Fulgoroid-specimens collected by H. Abdul-Nour gave a first idea of how rich the Delphacid and Cixiid-faunas of this area are: we could identify 21 delphacid and 15 cixiid-species, some of them not only being new to Lebanon, but new to science (Table 1). Descriptions of these species as well as detailed locality data are on work and will be published in separate papers.

The occurrence of some of these species in Lebanon seems to be quite remarkable, e.g. the finding of the Delphacid Megadelphax sordidulus (Stal) in Lebanon forms the southernmost point of its distribution; the species was recorded from South Russia and Turkey, but is still missing in Greece. Remanodelphax cedroni Dros., until recently considered to be endemic for Greece, was found in Lebanon (Abdul-Nour, 1983). A new Eurysa s. str.-species so far found only in Iraq was described by Remane & Asche (1986). In contrast, all cixiid taxa considered by us to be new species are so far endemic for Lebanon.

Considering the fact that faunistic studies in Lebanon have started only recently, we may expect a species number both in Delphacidae and Cixiidae at least double as high as known so far.
