SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES TO "A LIST OF THE DELPHACIDAE
(HOMOPTERA) IN JAPAN WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO
HOST PLANTS, TRANSMISSION OF PLANT DISEASES,
AND NATURAL ENEMIES"

Since the manuscript of a list of Japanese Delphacidae (Mochida & Okada 1971) went to the press, further information on these subjects has been given. Especially, Kinzelbach (1971) made up a taxonomic revision of strepsipterous insects over the world, and Fennah (1971) showed supplementary notes to Micronesian Delphacidae.
